1. Abortion is the intentional act of ending the life of another human being, while in the womb. Lawmakers should work to promote and protect the value of human life from conception to natural death, rather than further expansions of abortion access. (HB126-2026; HB42-2025; HB 148-2024)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Abortion is murder, period. I believe in the sanctity of life from conception to natural death with no exceptions.

2. The danger of chemical abortion has been heavily researched (see EPPC study). Lawmakers should work to ensure that women are fully informed and receive a medical examination prior to receiving such drugs. (HB64-2025; HB117-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

I believe these drugs should be outlawed.

3. Individuals and faith-based entities should have the right of conscience to freely live out their sincerely held convictions without fear of government infringement or retaliation. (HB 207-2025; SF 77-2025)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

4. Medical personnel should not be required to participate in any medical procedure or service that conflicts with the individual's sincerely held moral, ethical, or religious beliefs. (SF111-2023; HB143-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Government may not compel any citizen, in healthcare or any other field to violate their religious convictions.

5. Lawmakers should protect minors by ensuring that government-funded spaces, including libraries and public schools, restrict access to sexually explicit content, while recognizing the right of parents to make decisions regarding their minor children's access to such materials. (HB10-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

As Superintendent I took action, testifying before Congress, and issuing statewide guidance, in order to remove sexually explicit materials out of our school libraries.

6. Wyoming should recognize biological differences between men and women and protect girls' sports, locker rooms, and sex-designated spaces. (SF 44-2025; SF 62-2025; HB 72-2025; HB 32-2025; SF133-2023)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

As Superintendent, and Head Coach of the University of Wyoming Women's Rugby Team, I have fought to protect girls' sports and safe spaces-- including being a strong advocate for state legislation joining the Heritage Foundation and other Conservative education leaders on the steps of the U.S. Supreme Court.

7. Lawmakers should support legislation that helps parents stand up to government entities that attempt to circumvent their rights in raising their children. (Sf 09-2024; HB 200-2025)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

As Superintendent I have been a relentless advocate for parental rights and will continue to be as governor. This has included championing legislation to expand parental rights and notification, curriculum transparency efforts and the establishment of historic school choice.

8. Lawmakers should allow education funding to follow the child and protect parents' freedom to choose public, public charter, private, or homeschool options. (HB 166-2024; SF 61-2024; HB 199-2025; HB 94-2025; HB 46-2025; HB 23-2026)

As Superintendent I have championed and implemented historic expanded school choice, including state authorized charter schools and access to Education Savings Accounts. This will remain a priority when I am governor.

9. Lawmakers should support open enrollment policies that allow students to attend schools regardless of their geographic address. (SF 109-2025)

Growing up in Casper, I was a product of an open enrollment school district. I vividly remember attending orientation nights at various schools and being empowered to select which school best met my learning needs. As Superintendent, I supported a bill to provide for open enrollment statewide.
