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Candidate-submitted response. - 1** *1. Abortion is the intentional act of ending the life of another human being, while in the womb. Lawmakers should work to promote and protect the value of human life from conception to natural death, rather than further expansions of abortion access. (HB126-2026; HB42-2025; HB 148-2024)*

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

As a practicing catholic and unapologetic pro-lifer, I believe human life begins at conception and ends at natural death. I will always fight to uphold these principles.

- 2** *2. The danger of chemical abortion has been heavily researched (see EPPC study). Lawmakers should work to ensure that women are fully informed and receive a medical examination prior to receiving such drugs. (HB64-2025; HB117-2026)*

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

All medications have side effects and over-the-counter and prescription abortion drugs are no different. Woman should be fully-informed of the effects of these medications, the loss of an unborn baby, but also the short-term and long-term health consequences to the mother.

- 3** *3. Individuals and faith-based entities should have the right of conscience to freely live out their sincerely held convictions without fear of government infringement or retaliation. (HB 207-2025; SF 77-2025)*

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Religious freedom, choice, and the right to practice freely without any interference from the government is fully enshrined in our constitution, as a right given from God. The government should never retaliate against an individual or faith group because of their practice of their chosen religion.

4. Medical personnel should not be required to participate in any medical procedure or service that conflicts with the individual's sincerely held moral, ethical, or religious beliefs. (SF111-2023; HB143-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Medical personnel should not be forced or face retaliation for their objection to the performance of a medical procedure that conflicts with their moral, ethical, or faith beliefs. Any government doing so would fly in the face of our enshrined rights to the freedom of religious beliefs and practice.

5. Lawmakers should protect minors by ensuring that government-funded spaces, including libraries and public schools, restrict access to sexually explicit content, while recognizing the right of parents to make decisions regarding their minor children's access to such materials. (HB10-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

The government should not be the educator of our youth on sexually-related material. Parents and guardians should be responsible for that task as they see fit.

6. Wyoming should recognize biological differences between men and women and protect girls' sports, locker rooms, and sex-designated spaces. (SF 44-2025; SF 62-2025; HB 72-2025; HB 32-2025; SF133-2023)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree
