1. Abortion is the intentional act of ending the life of another human being, while in the womb. Lawmakers should work to promote and protect the value of human life from conception to natural death, rather than further expansions of abortion access. (HB126-2026; HB42-2025; HB 148-2024)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

I strongly agree. Every human life has inherent dignity and value, and I believe government has a responsibility to protect the most vulnerable among us. Throughout my public service, I have consistently supported pro-life principles and believe lawmakers should enact policies that affirm the sanctity of life, strengthen families, and protect both mothers and their unborn children. As a constitutional conservative, I believe Wyoming should continue promoting a culture that values life from conception to natural death.

2. The danger of chemical abortion has been heavily researched (see EPPC study). Lawmakers should work to ensure that women are fully informed and receive a medical examination prior to receiving such drugs. (HB64-2025; HB117-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

I strongly agree. Women deserve complete and accurate medical information before making any serious medical decision. Requiring a medical examination and informed consent helps protect both the health of the mother and the life of the unborn child. Healthcare decisions involving abortion should be made with appropriate physician oversight, not through mail-order prescriptions or without a thorough understanding of the medical risks involved. Patient safety, informed consent, and respect for human life should always guide public policy.

3. Individuals and faith-based entities should have the right of conscience to freely live out their sincerely held convictions without fear of government infringement or retaliation. (HB 207-2025; SF 77-2025)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

I strongly agree. The free exercise of religion is one of our nation's most fundamental constitutional freedoms. Individuals, churches, ministries, and faith-based organizations should never be forced by government to violate their sincerely held religious beliefs. Throughout my public service, I have been committed to defending the Constitutions of the United States and Wyoming, and that includes protecting the rights of people to live and practice their faith without government coercion or retaliation. While in the legislature, Curt was the only senator who received a 100% ranking on WyWatch's conservative scorecard.

4. Medical personnel should not be required to participate in any medical procedure or service that conflicts with the individual's sincerely held moral, ethical, or religious beliefs. (SF111-2023; HB143-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

I strongly agree. No healthcare professional should be forced by government or an employer to violate his or her deeply held moral, ethical, or religious convictions. Respecting conscience rights protects both individual liberty and the diversity of our healthcare system. I believe Wyoming should continue to defend these fundamental freedoms while ensuring patients have access to quality healthcare consistent with the protections guaranteed by the Constitutions of the United States and Wyoming.

5. Lawmakers should protect minors by ensuring that government-funded spaces, including libraries and public schools, restrict access to sexually explicit content, while recognizing the right of parents to make decisions regarding their minor children's access to such materials. (HB10-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Parents have the primary responsibility and authority to raise their children. Government-funded schools and libraries should provide age-appropriate educational resources while protecting children from sexually explicit materials. I believe parents-not government agencies or unelected officials-should make decisions regarding what is appropriate for their children. Wyoming should continue to respect parental rights while ensuring that public institutions reflect the values and expectations of the communities they serve.

6. Wyoming should recognize biological differences between men and women and protect girls' sports, locker rooms, and sex-designated spaces. (SF 44-2025; SF 62-2025; HB 72-2025; HB 32-2025; SF133-2023)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

I strongly support protecting opportunities, privacy and safety for women and girls. Biological differences between men and women are real, and public policy should recognize those differences. Wyoming has a responsibility to preserve fair competition in athletics and maintain privacy in sex-designated spaces while treating every individual with dignity and respect. I believe these policies provide clarity, fairness and common sense for our schools and communities.

7. Lawmakers should support legislation that helps parents stand up to government entities that attempt to circumvent their rights in raising their children. (Sf 09-2024; HB 200-2025)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Parents-not government-have the primary responsibility for raising their children. I support legislation that protects the fundamental rights of parents to make decisions concerning their children's education, healthcare and overall well-being. Throughout my public service, I have believed government's role is to support families, not replace them. Protecting parental rights is consistent with the constitutional principles of limited government, individual liberty and respect for the family as the foundation of a strong society.

8. Lawmakers should allow education funding to follow the child and protect parents' freedom to choose public, public charter, private, or homeschool options. (HB 166-2024; SF 61-2024; HB 199-2025; HB 94-2025; HB 46-2025; HB 23-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Parents are their children's first and most important teachers. I support policies that expand educational opportunities and empower parents to choose the learning environment that best meets the needs of their children. Every student learns differently, and families should have the freedom to pursue the educational path that gives their child the greatest opportunity to succeed. I believe educational funding should prioritize students and support parental choice while maintaining accountability for taxpayer dollars.

9. Lawmakers should support open enrollment policies that allow students to attend schools regardless of their geographic address. (SF 109-2025)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Families should have greater flexibility when choosing the school that best serves their child's educational needs. I support open enrollment because it expands opportunities for students while encouraging innovation and excellence throughout Wyoming's education system. Implementation should be fair, transparent and fiscally responsible, with appropriate consideration given to local capacity and transportation challenges, particularly in rural Wyoming.

10. Lawmakers should ensure that public schools and post-secondary educational institutions do not seek to enforce DEI (Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion) mandates, which promote discrimination by dividing individuals into classes of "oppressed" and "oppressor." (SF 103-2025; HB 147-2025)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Every individual should be treated with equal dignity and respect under the law. I oppose policies that classify or judge people based on race, ethnicity or other immutable characteristics rather than individual merit and personal responsibility. Educational institutions should focus on academic excellence, critical thinking and preparing students for success-not promoting ideological frameworks that divide people into competing groups. Wyoming should continue upholding the constitutional principle of equal treatment for every citizen.
