- 1** *1. Abortion is the intentional act of ending the life of another human being, while in the womb. Lawmakers should work to promote and protect the value of human life from conception to natural death, rather than further expansions of abortion access. (HB126-2026; HB42-2025; HB 148-2024)*

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

When I served in 2023 and 2024 I voted yes and/or co-sponsored on every piece of pro-life legislation.

- 2** *2. The danger of chemical abortion has been heavily researched (see EPPC study). Lawmakers should work to ensure that women are fully informed and receive a medical examination prior to receiving such drugs. (HB64-2025; HB117-2026)*

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Chemical abortion should be outlawed.

- 3** *3. Individuals and faith-based entities should have the right of conscience to freely live out their sincerely held convictions without fear of government infringement or retaliation. (HB 207-2025; SF 77-2025)*

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

I would have voted yes and co-sponsored both of these bills.

- 4** *4. Medical personnel should not be required to participate in any medical procedure or service that conflicts with the individual's sincerely held moral, ethical, or religious beliefs. (SF111-2023; HB143-2026)*

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

I would have voted yes on SF0111 but in 2023 Speaker Sommers let it die in his drawer. I would have voted yes and co-sponsored HB0143 in 2026.

5. Lawmakers should protect minors by ensuring that government-funded spaces, including libraries and public schools, restrict access to sexually explicit content, while recognizing the right of parents to make decisions regarding their minor children's access to such materials. (HB10-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

I would have voted yes and co-sponsored HB0010 in 2026. My opponent, Julie Jarvis, voted against it.

6. Wyoming should recognize biological differences between men and women and protect girls' sports, locker rooms, and sex-designated spaces. (SF 44-2025; SF 62-2025; HB 72-2025; HB 32-2025; SF133-2023)

I voted yes on SF0133 in 2023 and would have voted yes and co-sponsored the other bills listed. Incredibly, my opponent Julie Jarvis voted no on all those bills.

I voted yes on SF0009 in 2024 and helped defend it on the floor of WY House. I would have voted yes on HB0200 in 2025. My opponent Julie Jarvis voted no.

8. Lawmakers should allow education funding to follow the child and protect parents' freedom to choose public, public charter, private, or homeschool options. (HB 166-2024; SF 61-2024; HB 199-2025; HB 94-2025; HB 46-2025; HB 23-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

I voted yes on HB0166 and SF0061 in 2024. I would have voted yes on the other bills listed. My opponent voted yes on some of these but said that WY homeschoolers are "illiterate" and "let their kids run wild".
