1. Abortion is the intentional act of ending the life of another human being, while in the womb. Lawmakers should work to promote and protect the value of human life from conception to natural death, rather than further expansions of abortion access. (HB126-2026; HB42-2025; HB 148-2024)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Every unborn child is a precious gift from God that possesses an inherent, inviolable right to life. As a mother of two and a conservative lawmaker, I believe the state has a profound moral and constitutional duty to defend the most vulnerable among us from the moment of conception. My record in the Wyoming Legislature reflects this unyielding commitment. I have sponsored more pro-life legislation than any member in state history, and when the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade, it was my trigger law that successfully activated to protect unborn life across Wyoming. I will always stand as a definitive firewall against the radical abortion industry and fight to uphold the absolute sanctity of life.

2. The danger of chemical abortion has been heavily researched (see EPPC study). Lawmakers should work to ensure that women are fully informed and receive a medical examination prior to receiving such drugs. (HB64-2025; HB117-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Chemical abortions pose severe, documented physical and psychological risks, and the reckless distribution of these drugs by mail-order operations bypasses vital medical oversight. I strongly support rigorous safeguards that mandate full informed consent and require comprehensive, in-person medical examinations before any such drugs can be prescribed or administered. As Chairman of the Wyoming Freedom Caucus, I have consistently fought to hold the predatory chemical abortion industry accountable, eliminate regulatory loopholes, and protect both unborn children and mothers from these dangerous, taxpayer-funded abortion schemes. Government must prioritize health, safety, and the preservation of human life over administrative convenience.

3 *3. Individuals and faith-based entities should have the right of conscience to freely live out their sincerely held convictions without fear of government infringement or retaliation. (HB 207-2025; SF 77-2025)*

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Our fundamental right to religious liberty is a gift from God, protected by the First Amendment, and it extends far beyond the walls of a church. It was always intended to be a shield that protects the Church and individuals from government overreach, never a sword used by bureaucrats to scrub faith from the public square. True freedom of religion means that Christian business owners, faith-based charities, and private citizens must never be coerced by the state to violate their deeply held beliefs. In public service, I will always fiercely defend our right of conscience and ensure that the government never dictates how we worship, run our businesses, or live out our convictions.

4 *4. Medical personnel should not be required to participate in any medical procedure or service that conflicts with the individual's sincerely held moral, ethical, or religious beliefs. (SF111-2023; HB143-2026)*

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

No doctor, nurse, or medical professional should ever be forced by the government or an employer to choose between their livelihood and their deeply held moral convictions. Forcing healthcare providers to participate in procedures like abortion or gender-reassignment surgeries fundamentally violates their constitutional rights and the Hippocratic Oath. As Chairman of the House Labor and Health Committee, I have consistently fought to strengthen robust conscience protections for our medical workforce. Protecting the moral integrity of healthcare professionals ensures a free, ethical, and resilient medical community in Wyoming.

5 *5. Lawmakers should protect minors by ensuring that government-funded spaces, including libraries and public schools, restrict access to sexually explicit content, while recognizing the right of parents to make decisions regarding their minor children's access to such materials. (HB10-2026)*

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Taxpayer-funded spaces like public schools and community libraries must never be used to expose children to sexually explicit materials or age-inappropriate content. Protecting the innocence of minors is a fundamental duty of our communities and government entities. Parents, not unelected bureaucrats or radical activists, have the absolute right to direct the upbringing and moral education of their children. I am proud to support legislation like HB10 to establish common-sense guardrails that keep explicit content out of children's sections, ensuring our public institutions remain safe environments that respect parental authority and protect Wyoming families.

6 *6. Wyoming should recognize biological differences between men and women and protect girls' sports, locker rooms, and sex-designated spaces. (SF 44-2025; SF 62-2025; HB 72-2025; HB 32-2025; SF133-2023)*

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

God created men and women with immutable biological differences that must be recognized and respected. Allowing biological males to compete in female sports or enter private, sex-designated spaces completely undermines the safety, privacy, and fair competition that Wyoming girls deserve. Our daughters should never be forced to sacrifice their hard-earned athletic opportunities or their personal privacy to accommodate radical gender ideologies. In the legislature, I have stood firm alongside the Wyoming Freedom Caucus to pass robust protections for female athletics and sex-segregated spaces, and I will continue to defend the integrity and dignity of women and girls across our state without compromise.

7. Lawmakers should support legislation that helps parents stand up to government entities that attempt to circumvent their rights in raising their children. (Sf 09-2024; HB 200-2025)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

The nuclear family is the fundamental building block of a free society, and parental rights are supreme. No government agency, school district, or medical entity has the right to circumvent, deceive, or override parents when it comes to the mental, physical, or spiritual well-being of their children. We have seen an alarming push by public entities to hide critical behavioral and medical information from mothers and fathers. I will always advocate for legislation that reinforces parental rights, mandates total institutional transparency, and provides families with the legal tools necessary to halt government overreach and protect their children.

8. Lawmakers should allow education funding to follow the child and protect parents' freedom to choose public, public charter, private, or homeschool options. (HB 166-2024; SF 61-2024; HB 199-2025; HB 94-2025; HB 46-2025; HB 23-2026)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Education funding belongs to the taxpayers and should be used to educate children, not to prop up a centralized government monopoly. Parents have the God-given right and responsibility to direct their children's education, and true education freedom means allowing that funding to follow the child to the environment that best serves their needs-whether that is public, charter, private, or a homeschool setting. Empowering families with choice fosters healthy competition, elevates educational standards across the board, and ensures that Wyoming children are educated, not indoctrinated. I will always support legislation that expands school choice while fiercely protecting private and homeschool options from state regulation or strings-attached federal mandates.

9. Lawmakers should support open enrollment policies that allow students to attend schools regardless of their geographic address. (SF 109-2025)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

A child's zip code or geographic address should never restrict their access to a high-quality education. Open enrollment policies put power back into the hands of parents, allowing them to transfer their children to public schools that align with their educational values and academic standards. This flexibility is especially vital for rural Wyoming families who may live closer to a school outside their designated district boundaries or whose local school is failing to meet their child's needs. By breaking down arbitrary district barriers, we create a more responsive public education system that prioritizes student success and parental intent over bureaucratic lines on a map.

10. Lawmakers should ensure that public schools and post-secondary educational institutions do not seek to enforce DEI (Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion) mandates, which promote discrimination by dividing individuals into classes of "oppressed" and "oppressor." (SF 103-2025; HB 147-2025)

RESPONSE Strongly Agree

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) frameworks are a Trojan horse for cultural Marxism, designed to reject individual merit and instead categorize citizens into hostile groups of "oppressors" and "oppressed." These divisive mandates have no place in Wyoming's classrooms, universities, or state boards. Our educational institutions should be centers of academic excellence, critical thinking, and equal opportunity based on character and hard work, not ideological echo chambers that enforce reverse discrimination and political conformity. I don't just talk about this issue-I led the charge against it. I proudly sponsored and passed HB 147, which successfully enacted a historic, statewide ban on DEI programming and prohibited state institutions from enforcing or requiring instruction in institutional discrimination. As Chairman of the Wyoming Freedom Caucus, I will continue to aggressively defend this law and ensure we permanently root out these radical administrative agendas from public education and our state university system, safeguarding true constitutional equality for every individual.
