FIVE BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES FOR FAITHFUL CIVIC STEWARDSHIP

1

GOVERNMENT'S GOD-ORDAINED ROLE

Scripture teaches that government exists "to punish evil and reward those who do good" (Romans 13; 1 Peter 2). Its purpose is not to replace the family or the church, but to uphold justice and preserve order. This role is most effective when government remains limited, accountable, and rooted in principles that recognize the inherent dignity of every person.

GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS ARE MINISTERS OF GOD

Romans 13 refers to government officials as "ministers of God." They are entrusted to uphold justice and restrain evil. Christians should therefore pray for, build relationships with, submit to, and honor those in authority (1 Timothy 2:1-2; Romans 13:1-7; 1 Peter 2:17; Daniel 2:20-21).

RIGHTEOUS LAW MATTERS IN SOCIETY

Moral law is not arbitrary; it reflects God's character and guides human flourishing. Laws do more than regulate behavior: they teach and shape culture over time. Godly leaders help preserve freedom, protect families, and promote stability. "When the righteous are in authority, the people rejoice" (Proverbs 29:2).

GOVERNMENT CANNOT PROPERLY DO ITS JOB WITHOUT THE CHURCH

Throughout history, unchecked power has drifted from truth. Scripture shows God raising up Joseph, Esther, Daniel, and others to speak truth to those in authority for the good of His people. That responsibility remains. Informed and engaged Christians help ensure that truth is not absent from the public square. Healthy government depends on citizens who understand both their rights and their responsibility to uphold what is good, just, and true.

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In a nation where citizens directly influence who serves in government, voting is more than a civic duty; it is an act of stewardship.

To steward your vote well:

- Understand the principles that lead to human flourishing.
- Evaluate candidates by their stated principles and voting records.
- Engage the issues that affect families, freedom, and Biblical values.

Each election is an opportunity to influence Wyoming's direction. Faithful stewardship means making informed decisions that align with truth and contribute to the state's long-term good (Matthew 25:14-30).
